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
## ADDENDUM TO THE "I" ITEM NOTE

Subject:	Implementation of the Strategy and Action Plan to Combat Terrorism

Delegations will find enclosed an updated version of the implementation of the legislative instruments listed in the Declaration on terrorism of the European Council of 25 March 2004 - State of play as on 24 May 2007.

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## Implementation of the legislative Instruments listed in the Declaration on terrorism of the European Council of 25 March 2004 <u>- state as of 24 May 2007</u>



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y= in case of a Framework Decision: implementation completed, legislation has entered into force; -= implementation not completed; c= implementation completed, legislation has not entered into force; p= implemented in part; in case the Commission has already submitted a report on the implementation of an instrument (by the old Member States), the report is taken account of;

y= in case of a Convention or a Protocol: notified the General Secretariat of the Council that the Member State has ratified the instrument; - = no notification

EL has indicated that its draft legislation to implement the FD on Joint Investigation Teams has been submitted to the Greek Parliament.

IT has indicated that its draft legislation to implement the FD on Joint Investigation Teams is currently pending before its Parliament.

CZ has indicated that it has implemented the FD on Combating Terrorism with the exception of the provisions on liability of legal persons.

SK has informed that it has implemented the FD on Combating Terrorism with the exception of the provisions on liability of legal persons.

Criminal liability of legal persons will be established in the framework of the new Criminal Code which is currently in preparation.

CZ has indicated that draft legislation to fully implement the Framework Decision is being discussed in Parliament.

LU has indicated that it will implement the FD together with the 3rd Directive on money laundering. Legislation is currently being drafted.

MT has informed of the implementation of FD, but has not submitted information whether the legislation has already entered into force.

RO has indicated that most of the provisions has already been transposed into Romanian legislation.



Implementation completed in all EU Member States except Bulgaria and Romania (see footnote 23):

- Protocol of 30 November 2000 amending the Europol Convention: Entered into force on 29 March 2007
- Protocol of 28 November 2002 amending the Europol Convention and the Protocol on the privileges and immunities of Europol: Entered into force 29 March 2007
- Protocol of 27 November 2003 amending the Europol Convention: Entered into force 18 April 2007

Articles 3(3) and (4) of the Protocol concerning the conditions and arrangements for admission of the republic of Bulgaria and Romania to the European Union (See Official Journal L 157, 21/6/2005, p.29) read as follows:

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<sup>&</sup>quot;3. Bulgaria and Romania accede to the conventions and protocols listed in Annex I. Those conventions and protocols shall enter into force in relation to Bulgaria and Romania on the date determined by the Council in the decision referred to in paragraph 4."

<sup>&</sup>quot;4. The Council, acting unanimously on a recommendation by the Commission and after consulting the European Parliament, shall adopt European decisions making all adjustments required by reason of accession to the conventions and protocols referred to in paragraph 3 and publish the adapted text in the Official Journal of the European Union."

The Annex referred to in paragraph 3 lists the following Conventions as well as the Protocols amending or supplementing these Conventions:

Recently the Commission has submitted draft Council Decisions regulating the accession of Bulgaria and Romania to the 2000 MLA Convention and the 2001 Protocol. Following the examination of a Council Working Party of the draft Council Decisions and upon the receipt of the opinion of the European Parliament, the Council will take a formal decision regarding the accession of Bulgaria and Romania.

The Presidency has requested an overview of the state of play of ratifications of the 2000 MLA Convention and invited delegations that has not yet ratified the Convention to give explanation on the reasons delaying the ratification procedures (3 April 2007 doc. 8257/07 CATS 29 COPEN 43)

EE has indicated that the ratification procedure is ongoing.
