Subject :	Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulation (EC) No 717/2007 on roaming on public mobile telephone networks within the Community and Directive 2002/21/EC on a common regulatory framework for electronic communications networks and services [first reading] - Adoption of the legislative act (LA + S)

- On 26 September 2008 <u>the Commission</u> submitted to the Council the above proposal<sup>1</sup> based on Article 95 of the EC Treaty.
- 2. <u>The European Economic and Social Committee</u> delivered its opinion<sup>2</sup> on 15 January 2009.
- In accordance with the joint declaration on practical arrangements for the codecision procedure<sup>3</sup>, informal talks were held between the Council, the European Parliament and the Commission, with a view to reaching agreement at first reading.

- 4. <u>The European Parliament</u> delivered its Opinion at first reading on 22 April 2009, adopting one amendment to the Commission proposal. The outcome of the vote in the European Parliament<sup>1</sup> reflects the compromise agreement reached between the institutions and should therefore be acceptable to the Council.
- 5. The Permanent Representatives Committee is consequently invited to confirm its agreement and suggest that the Council:
  - adopt the Regulation, as set out in PE-CONS 3645/09, as an "A" item at a forthcoming meeting, with the Latvian and Spanish delegations abstaining;
  - have the statements set out in <u>the addendum</u> to this note entered in the minutes of that meeting.

When it has been signed by the President of the European Parliament, the President of the Council and the Secretaries-General of the two institutions, the legislative act will be published in the Official Journal of the European Union.
