**Legislative deliberations**

(public deliberation in accordance with Article 16(8) of the Treaty on the European Union)

Proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council on the application of **patients' rights** in cross-border healthcare (\*)

(Legal basis proposed by the Commission: Article 114 of the TFEU)

- Political agreement

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On page 22 of document ST 9948/10 INIT, the paragraph (40a) should read:

(40a) The Commission should be empowered to adopt delegated acts in accordance with Article 290 of the Treaty in respect of measures that would exclude specific categories of medicinal products or medical devices from the recognition of prescriptions, as provided for in this Directive.

On page 44 of document ST 9948/10 INIT, the paragraph (1) of Article 16a should read:

1. The powers to adopt delegated acts referred to in Article 12(5) shall be conferred on the Commission for a period of 5 years beginning on ...<sup>\*</sup>. The Commission shall make a report in respect of the delegated powers not later than 6 months before the end of the 5 year period. The delegation of powers shall be automatically extended for periods of an identical duration, unless the European Parliament or the Council revokes it in accordance with Article 16b.

On page 45 of document ST 9948/10 INIT, the paragraph (1) of Article 16b should read:

1. The delegation of power referred to in Article 12(5) may be revoked by the European Parliament or by the Council.
