- At its meeting on 23 July 2012, the <u>Working Party on Financial Agricultural Questions</u> (AGRIFIN) examined the Special Report No 9/2012 from the European Court of Auditors entitled 'Audit of the control system governing the production, processing, distribution and imports of organic products' (doc.12119/12).
- 2. At its meeting on 7 September 2012, the <u>Working Party on Financial Agricultural Questions</u> (AGRIFIN) discussed draft Council Conclusions on the Special Report (doc.12728/12)
- After the meeting on 7 September 2012 and in the light of these discussions, the Presidency drew up the final version of the draft Council Conclusions, which the <u>General Secretariat of</u> <u>the Council</u> then circulated and which all delegations were able to accept.

4. In accordance with the Conclusions adopted by the Council on 8 May 2000 on improving the examination of special reports drawn up by the Court of Auditors, the <u>Working Party on Financial Agricultural Questions (AGRIFIN)</u> invites the <u>Permanent Representatives</u> <u>Committee</u> to suggest to the <u>Council</u> that it adopt the Council Conclusions as set out in the <u>Annex</u> to this note as an "A" item at a forthcoming session.

## **COUNCIL CONCLUSIONS**

# on the Special Report No 9/2012 from the European Court of Auditors entitled 'Audit of the control system governing the production, processing, distribution and imports of organic products '

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- WELCOMES the Special Report No 9/2012 from the European Court of Auditors entitled 'Audit of the control system governing the production, processing, distribution and imports of organic products';
- (2) RECALLS the essential role of the control system of organic products in order to ensure consumer confidence, protect consumer interests and ensure the effective functioning of the internal market;
- (3) UNDERLINES the importance of adequate and timely exchange of information within Member States, between Member States and control bodies, between Member States, and between Member States and the Commission; INVITES the Commission as well as the Member States to continue to work together in order to ensure a direct flow of all relevant information on infringements and irregularities;
- ENCOURAGES both the Commission and the Member States to work together in order to strengthen their monitoring and supervisory roles respectively;
- (5) ENCOURAGES the Commission to work towards increased harmonisation of the control and supervision measures enforced in the Member States.
- (6) STRESSES that coordination between control bodies, stakeholders and authorities is essential for the traceability of organic products; INVITES the Commission to evaluate whether improvements are necessary for the application of organic traceability requirements and to underpin the integrity of the organic production system;

- (7) NOTES the intrinsic weak nesses outlined by the Court of the system of import authorisation; WELCOMES the introduction of a new system of recognised control bodies, managed directly by the Commission and Member States, ensuring harmonised application of the import regime at the EU borders;
- (8) STRESSES the necessity of ensuring that control systems in third countries recognised as equivalent for organic production fulfil all regulatory requirements; CONSIDERS that the Commission could strengthen the supervision of third countries' control systems; INVITES the Commission, in co-operation with Member States to assess the feasibility of establishing European electronic import certificates in order to facilitate and reinforce the control procedures at EU border;
- (9) NOTES that the Commission is currently assessing the EU legal framework governing organic production; CONSIDERS, in this context, that the Court's recommendations could be taken into account in this assessment.
